Re-organization

J. Hoover moved to appoint the same officers as last year.

Minutes

J. Hoover moved to approve the September 23, 2009, minutes.

M. Smelgus seconded. The motion carried with all in favor.

Windy Hill Road Bridge Raising Project

The sewer line must be moved in connection with PennDOT's bridge raising in Tolna. The Borough's share will be approximately \$25,000.00 plus the cost of disposal of the asbestos piping. An agreement will be forwarded by PennDOT for signature.

J. Hoover moved to authorize the Chairman and Secretary to sign the agreement with PennDOT after review by Engineer Holley's office.

G. Smith seconded. The motion carried with all in favor.

Tapping Fee Resolution

J. Hoover moved to adopt Resolution #2010-1 adopting the tapping fee of \$1,868.26 per the Act 57 study performed by Engineer Holley's office.

G. Smith seconded. The motion carried with all in favor.

Sewer Rates

J. Hoover moved to adopt Resolution #2010-2 adopting the revised sewer rates.

G. Smith seconded. The motion carried with all in favor.

Sewer Flows

The May, 2010, sewer flows averaged 534,000 gallons per day which is 42% of the sewer plant total capacity. New Freedom Borough has done a lot of sewer repair work and their flows should decrease as well. The Authority thanked Brian for his diligent work in reducing infiltration. The sewer camera is paying for itself.

Deer Creek Pump Station

The Deer Creek sewer sump pump line cracked and creek water was entering the wet well at approximately seven gallons a minute. The repair cost was \$2,685.00.

Elm Drive Sewer Repair

The old lateral at 505 Elm Drive was backed up and several leaks and smashed piping were found. The lateral was 100 feet long with large amounts of groundwater infiltration. The repair cost was \$10,604.50 and was done by Springfield Contractors.

New Freedom Capital Projects

There are \$108,500.00 worth of capital projects to be done this year at the treatment plant that were not budgeted.
